### **RECTOR'S LETTER – NOVEMBER 2017**

November 26<sup>th</sup>- Crib Blessing: Each year we have continued a tradition of sending 'the Holy Family' on a journey around our villages on their way to 'the stable'. Unfortunately, it appears that funding for the initial stages of the bypass has been delayed. Although work was planned on environmental studies, it is pointless to proceed with this until the bypass funding has been approved; the environment changes and therefore these studies would have to be repeated if construction were not to commence within a specific time period.

Councillor Grant has recently had a meeting with Andrea Leadsom and at her request has sent a letter to her at the Houses of Parliament, specifying the exact Parish requirements so that she can investigate other more targeted Central Government funding opportunities relating to the relief of rural towns and villages which are suffering severely with problems caused by substantial increases in HGV traffic.

On a more positive note, we are really pleased to announce that a defibrillator and cabinet have been ordered for the village. We hope to have it installed prior to Christmas, dependent on delivery and installation times.

The defibrillator will be located at the Fox on Baker Street and the plan is to site it near to the village noticeboard.

Councillor Thomas is working on a plan for a first responder list which would be distributed around the village and would include details and contact numbers for those trained in the use of the defibrillator. Included in the cost of the unit is two hours of training; if anyone is interested in attending the training and being included on the first responder list, please contact Pip Clayton by emailing <a href="mailto:clerk@farthinghoeparishcouncil.org">clerk@farthinghoeparishcouncil.org</a>

The Parish Council would like to thank Neil at the Fox for allowing the defibrillator to be sited on the property. A huge thank you also goes to those who spent considerable time organising and running fund raising events, those who attended the events and those who made individual donations to the fund – without all of you, the purchase of this potentially life-saving equipment would not have been possible.

We have been informed that Cockley Road will be closed on 20<sup>th</sup> November between 9.30am and 3.30pm to allow for road repairs from Abbey Lodge Farm through to the road to Halse.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Wednesday, 8<sup>th</sup> November 2017 at 7pm in the Beasley Room at the Village Hall.

### Are the police and criminal justice service providing the right support for people with mental illness?

This is the question being asked by Stephen Mold, Northamptonshire Police and Crime Commissioner as he launches a Time2Listen mental health consultation.

The consultation is now live at <a href="www.time2listennorthants.co.uk">www.time2listennorthants.co.uk</a> - and is focussed on gaining a better understanding of the experience of people with mental illness, ADHD and Autism - and their interactions with the police and criminal justice service in Northamptonshire.

Northamptonshire Police spends more than 20% of its time supporting victims of crime and detainees with mental health needs. Over the next three months, the commissioner wants to hear from local people to get a true picture of how effective the police and the criminal justice services are in supporting people with mental illness and what can be done to improve those interactions.

Stephen Mold said: "This is a really important consultation. One in four people experience mental illness, and while many have little or no contact with the police, it's vital we take the time to listen and find out if individuals with mental ill health who are in contact - be it through their neighbourhood, as a victim or witness, or someone who has been involved in crime — are receiving the right support from the police and from the wider criminal justice system.

"I want to hear from as many people as ... this is a real opportunity to learn from people's experiences."

The Time2Listen consultation will hear from people via face to face interviews, telephone conversations, focus groups, workshops and by an online survey. The consultation is also open to parents, carers and loved ones of those with mental illnesses, ADHD and Autism.

The consultation is being led by Helen Cook, Head of Involvement and Communications at the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner. She said: "As well as speaking to people with experience of mental illness, Time2Listen will also consult with professionals and support agencies working within the criminal justice system, such as police officers, probation officers and mental health workers.

The outcomes and any recommendations from the consultation will be shared with the Northamptonshire Mental Health Criminal Justice Board.

### **Compost Corner November 2017**

I found a dozen naked ladies in my back garden last month.

I shouldn't have been surprised because I had planted 12 corms of *colchicum autumnale* a few weeks earlier. Large pale lilac coloured flowers bloomed briefly on bare stems (hence the name "naked ladies") before flopping over in Brian's windy gusts. Their leaves will not emerge until spring.

I left their vivid orange stigmas intact this year, to allow the plants to get established, with the intention, next year, of harvesting their delicate saffron strands to put in my paella. It was lucky that I paused because it turns out that I had confused *colchicum autumnale*, also known as meadow saffron and as the autumn crocus (although unrelated to the crocus), with *crocus sativus*, a true crocus which flowers in the Autumn and is also called autumn crocus! It is this *crocus sativus* which produces the intensely orange stigmas and styles we know as saffron, that most delicate of spices, and so it is also known as the saffron crocus!


Do botanists have any imagination when it comes to naming plants?

You may have thought that the stamens of those innocent looking naked ladies would have been as harmless as saffron and just as useful. You would be wrong! *Colchicum autumnale* is deadly poisonous! Thanks to its colchicine content, all parts of the plant are toxic when ingested. Although, used wisely and in very small doses, colchicine is employed pharmaceutically in the treatment of gout attacks and one or two other niche indications.

Being lucky to be free, so far, of gout, I am leaving my naked ladies unmolested.

Instead, I will seek out a supply of bulbs of the **real** autumn crocus to plant next year and endeavour not to get them mixed up with their toxic counterfeiters!


