The first step in the heating project has taken place - an upgrade to the insulation in the roof space, preceded by repairing the seals around all the windows. You can now feel a temperature difference as you walk into the Hall and the heating system is yet to be installed! A decision on the new heating system will be taken soon, as we now have an option to install a system with our own funds and work towards a grant supported renewable system to power it.

Grand Allotment Tidy Up

Saturday January 26th 2019

In order to start the 2019 horticultural season on a fine note, a grand allotment tidy up is planned for Saturday January 26th.

We have a few distressed plots that need rescuing from Mother Nature's tenacious grasp, and the hedges and trees along the perimeter, particularly those growing in gardens alongside, could do with trimming in some cases and major pruning in others. Not every plot holder has the tools, expertise or physical strength to accomplish some of the more daunting jobs.

This is an invitation to anyone, not just allotment holders, to come along at 9am on Saturday January 26th, bringing any tools that they can use or wish to share or just their enthusiasm and a wish to help. I hope that we will get someone with specialist equipment or expertise to do the trickier tasks such as tree pruning, hedgecutting, and shrub removal.

The allotments will then be easier and more attractive to work on, be more productive and look like the village asset that they are. So get oiling those shafts so that your tool is in prime condition for January's challenge!

Rough Guide to the PCC - Parochial Church Council

The PCC looks after the general running of the Church and oversees the finances of the same by law.

The PCC consists of various members; the Rector; 6 or 9 elected PCC members, plus exoficio member, namely the 2 Churchwardens; Deanery Synod Representatives, and the nominated officers being the **PCC secretary**and the **PCC treasurer**.

All Parochial Church Councillors are elected to and serve for a maximum period of three consecutive years, after which they are required to stand down before seeking reelection. It is ideal if 1/3 of the PCC's members are elected each year.

Any member of the church can stand for election onto the PCC as long as they have registered to be on the Church Electoral Role and are over 18 years of age.

You should find a list of your local PCC members displayed in your church with a list of members on the church Electoral role.

Look out for more 'rough guides' to other church posts in the coming weeks.
