It is a great pleasure for me to be writing my 1st pastoral letter. To begin I want to offer my very grateful thanks to everyone who was involved in, or attended, my Installation on March 30th. It was a wonderful day, and the welcome and hospitality that was offered on the day was truly outstanding, thank you all.

To give you some background information; I have been married to Nic for 32 years and we have two wonderful sons, Christian and Matthew. I have enjoyed two careers already before becoming a Priest. My first was as a hairstylist, a career I loved, and which I often compare with my role as a Priest; I held as many peoples secrets and troubles then, as I do now. And later I worked in care for the elderly, eight years of which were spent as an Activities Coordinator in a Care Home. These careers I enjoyed very much and helped to shape me for my work now. We are well into Spring now, and enjoying the longer days and warmer weather. But it struck me again just how quickly time flies. It is said that time flies when you're having fun, so I guess I must be having a whale of a time!!

Having just been enjoying another Easter season, I reflected on how many children and young people have no real knowledge of who Jesus is. They can tell me about the Easter bunny, but don't really know much about Jesus. Even amongst adults there is sometimes a big gap in peoples understanding of who Jesus is. Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God, and that God sent Jesus, his own son, into this dark and troubled world to show us another way to live, a better way; you might even say a simpler way. Councillor Breese gave an overview to the current situation regarding the planned conversion to Unitary Councils. She explained in detail the work that had been underway so far, and also answered a question concerning the Northamptonshire County Council debt.

We will all be aware that there has been some very successful campaigning in support of a bypass for Farthinghoe, and April 26th saw the presentation to Andrea Leadsom, at her Brackley Surgery, of a Petition containing some 3500 signatures in support of a Farthinghoe Bypass. These signatures were collected from both an online e-petition and from some very successful petitioning in the local Tescos in Brackley and Banbury. Very well done to all of the volunteers who participated in this.

Signs can also be seen in the village directing drivers to the online petition at www.fbypass.com & these are working to good effect.

The Hall facility continues to progress as planned with regular income now covering the running costs which have been trimmed further this year. Several successful fundraising events have seen income increase to give a current bank balance of around £17,500. The regular monthly income and expenditure statements are available from the website

- www.farthinghoevillagehall.org as are the minutes and 150 Club results.

The Social events have been well received to the end of 2018 and the Film and Table Tennis clubs have been gaining traction. We are looking forward to a special Village show in September which is planned to be of interest to all the Village.

We now have an opportunity to install a wooden floor and electric heating from existing funds. This will have a massive impact on the environment and make the facility more saleable and enjoyable for the Village as well as improving the structure by providing a consistent temperature. The roof insulation has been installed and already makes a big difference. However, the running costs will increase until we have the funds to install Solar PV which will generate the electricity required to run the heating etc. This will be the subject of separate fundraising activity, including grant application etc.

The Committee has seen a number of changes during the year, but all members are active and committed to continue the development of the Hall and its processes and procedures. The Parish Council, Church and School have representatives attending every meeting, and I must thank all the Committee for their commitment and enthusiasm during the year.

The 2019/2020 Goals are published on the website which provides all the information required for Villagers to keep in touch with events.

The late Bob Osborne

Extracts from the eulogy given at his funeral by Sid Atkins

Bob moved to Farthinghoe with his wife Julia in 1986 having selected the location based upon the proximity to the Oxford & Grand union canals which enabled them to buy their beloved narrowboat 'Cloud'.

Bob & Julia immersed themselves in village life becoming involved with the village hall committee & helping out at village events wherever possible. Bob was working on ships radar systems which took him around the globe. He always looked forward to returning to the village and regaling events encountered on his trips in the Fox of a <u>Friday</u> or <u>Saturday evening</u>.

Much of Bob's time prior to his retirement was spent in Turkey working on a number of ships for the Turkish Navy. Sadly having witnessed first-hand the devastation caused in the 1999 Izmit earthquake. Bob was highly regarded by the Turkish Navy & was touched when they presented him with a plaque thanking him for his for his services when he retired.

Following his retirement many long voyages on Cloud were taken, traveling the length & breadth of the canal system including excursions along the Thames in London, the Nene, Ouse & Soar rivers before re-joining the canal network, often accompanied by their lifelong friends Dick & Linda.

Bobs best friend Dick, Linda's husband was sadly lost to cancer in 2004, 2012 saw the devastation of Julia losing her battle to cancer with Linda losing her closest friend and Bob being inconsolable.

Bob & Linda got together in 2013 and they enjoyed each other's companionship cruising the Caribbean travelling to China & Marrakesh. Bob divided his time with Linda between Farthinghoe & Billingborough and the pair of them would often been seen at film nights, church fete & village show helping with the entrance or manning stalls many a time.

With Bob's health deteriorating, losing Linda in October 2018 was a real blow from which he was never to recover.

I know that Bob will be sorely missed within the village for all of his support & encouragement to everyone who knew him.

Dear Farthinghoe,

Many of you will know me but I'm Alice and I've lived in Farthinghoe for 11 years. I went to Farthinghoe primary school and i'm now in year 12 at Chenderit in Middleton Cheney.

During the first week of the Easter holidays, I travelled up to the Isle of Coll, a small island (population of 170) which is about a three hour ferry from Oban, Scotland. I went there not for a holiday, but to attend a selection course with the charity Project Trust. The course was to filter who was ready to volunteer for a year abroad and after a week of patiently waiting, I've had the exciting news that i've been selected to teach English in Thailand - my first choice country! For a long time now, it has been a goal of mine to do something big to give back to a community and teaching for a year abroad is the most amazing opportunity to do this.

Project Trust Project Trust is an Educational Gap Year Charity, sending roughly 300 school-leavers overseas every year to volunteer in mainly teaching, Social Care and Outward Bound projects across Africa, Asia and The Americas. The charity is based on the Isle of Coll and provides all Volunteers with training and support before, during and after their time overseas, to maximise both the educational value of their experience and the positive impact they have in their projects and host communities.

Schools in Thailand are often under resourced, especially in rural areas. Often teachers are left to teach more than one subject at different academic levels. I will be undertaking the TESOL project - teaching english to speakers of other languages. I hope to build primary and secondary school aged students confidence when it comes to speaking English. I also plan to organise extra curricular activities to build the students skills and so that they can have fun!

In order to embark on my journey, I need to raise £6200 by the summer of 2020 (I will be leaving for Thailand around August in 2020). The money will go directly to Project Trust to pay for the accommodation, travel, insurance and living costs needed for the year. In order to do this, I plan to organise a host of events including a Thai pop up food evening, a Scottish ceilidh dance and a quiz night as well as the classic bake sales - I would love as many people as possible to come and attend! I also have a Virgin Money Giving page set up so online donations can be made no matter how big or small - anything would be massively appreciated (https://uk.virginmoneygiving.com/AliceRowe2).
