Pastoral Letter – December 2019

There is a song played every year at Christmas that is blasted out in the shops and on the telly, and it goes, "It's the most wonderful time of the year!".

Children would agree with that I am sure, but sadly something of the wonder and joy of Christmas has been lost in our culture and society as the story of Christ's birth has been side lined from Christmas, and it has become much more secularised and consumer driven. So much so that many peoples understanding of Jesus is that he was just a good man...and many folk think he was just a great teacher and philosopher...and they will try to live their lives by the values he taught,...but as great as these understandings about Jesus are, they miss the point of Jesus's life.

The point of Jesus' life was to show us the way back to God. Jesus is much more than just a good man or a great teacher,,, because He actually claimed to be God's son, and claimed that He had been sent to the world to be our Saviour because God loves us. We live in such a complex world, with great good demonstrated by people,, but also great evil by others. Because of the evil in the world many folk cannot bring themselves to believe that there is a God who loves his creation, and who loves the people of the world. Many folk would say if God is so good and loving, why doesn't he do something?

2000 years ago in Bethlehem God did do something, He sent his one and only son Jesus to show us the way to live, and the way back to Gods heart. And the world would be a very different place if everyone tried to live how Jesus taught us to.



In reality we can only imagine what it might have been like that 1st Christmas among the dusty busy streets of Bethlehem, But if you will allow yourself to believe the good news the Angels and Shepherds proclaimed, if you will open your heart and mind to God, and to see Jesus as more than just a good man or great teacher, then Christmas is indeed the most wonderful time of the year. It is wonderful because Jesus is more than that,, He is the light of the world, the hope of the nations, God's very own son and our Saviour.

FARTHINGHOE PRIMARY SCHOOL

Since our return to school in September, it has been extremely busy at Farthinghoe Primary School. Our keystage 1 children have thoroughly enjoyed their new topic 'The Park', which allowed for an obligatory trip to the wonderful village park.

Our keystage 2 children have been exploring Europe for their topic, which they chose to inspire their fantastic fundraising mission for Children in Need. Beth and Rosie (year 5) have provided us with a report of their fundraising activity - On the Friday 15th November at Farthinghoe Primary School there was a European Café to raise money for Children in Need; in total we raised a whopping £,190.14.

We were all given a country that we had to find recipes and food from. Some were sweet and some were savoury but some people made both. Everybody made fantastic food for the hungry parents. Thank you to everyone who came and helped our school raise lots of money for Children in Need.

Along with our 'Children in Need' fundraising, we also, for the first time in many years, sold poppies at school for the Royal British Legion. Our Charity Ambassadors and year 6 pupils took their responsibility of selling them each day, very seriously and we raised £67.71. Selling and buying the poppies provided an opportunity for the children to learn about why some people wear a red poppy at this time of year to remember those men and women who have died or been injured in conflict. The whole school came together on the playground at 11am on 11^{th} November to observe a 2 minutes silence.

As we rapidly approach Christmas, the whole school is working together for our end of term production of 'The Nutcracker'. Rehearsals are taking place in the church and all the children are embracing learning their lines and practising the songs - our after-school ballet club have been practising hard for their performance too.

With Christmas in mind, we would like to take this opportunity to wish all of our friends, families and the local community a very Merry Christmas and a peaceful New Year.
