Farthinghoe Village Action Day on 8th February 2019 with the visit of the Rt Hon. Andrea Leadsom MP

Every household will have received a copy of an introductory letter from Andrea Leadsom MP announcing her intention to visit Farthinghoe for a Village Action Day & on the back of each letter was a Farthinghoe Residents' Survey. 112 completed survey forms were returned with 87% of answers for Q3 being in the "Important" or "Very Important" category

The day was planned to be in 3 distinct sections:

- Visit to School (10.00 am to 10.30 am)
- Visit to the Coffee Morning at the Church (10.30 am to 11.30 am)
- Visits to houses to which Andrea had been pre-invited to discuss specific subjects (11.30 am onwards)

1 School:

Andrea was welcomed to the school by Wendy Whitehouse. Steve Wilson & John Boyd.

Following this welcome the very impressive school project board displaying many items about road safety, traffic statistics & the by-pass was presented to Andrea & her questions were very competently answered by Maggie Bullock & Lauren Boyd.

This was followed by visiting the 3 classrooms in turn, sitting with the pupils to accept & answer many questions related to the by-pass & road safety. Very proud to call this our village school.

2 Coffee Morning at Farthinghoe Church:

It is always difficult to try to assess in advance the number of people who will attend such an event but I should not have worried.

To all of those involved in preparing the coffee & superb cakes a very big thank you for coming up trumps with more than adequate provision at very short notice.

Andrea bought us up to date in great detail about her quest to find funding for the design & construction of the by-pass, something she has been working on since early 2018 when it became clear that this could not be provided by NCC. The source of finance was identified as the MRN Consultation, but initially there were several criteria which might have precluded our by-pass project from qualification.

Andrea confirmed that these barriers had now been removed & both the A422 in general & the Farthinghoe by-pass in particular qualify to allow bids for finance.

It is agreed that the funding bid for our by-pass will be jointly prepared by NCC Highways, SEMLEP & EEHSA. Andrea will chair the joint meetings of these 3 authorities to ensure no undue delays occur & the first such meeting will take place on May 3rd. It is hoped that the bid will be finalised & submitted by July 2019.

There was increased optimism following this news, but It must be made clear that this is still at bid preparation stage & that finance is not yet guaranteed. Once it becomes clear that funding has been confirmed by MRN then Design & Planning can begin in detail as well as a resumption of dialogue with those people with detailed design concerns.

Andrea continued to take further questions from individuals about this & about other subjects which were of concern.

At around 11.30 the meeting at the church came to an end with Andrea & her party moving on to their prearranged private meetings in the village.

The Rt Hon. Andrea Leadsom writes:

It was great to have the opportunity to speak directly with so many residents when I visited Farthinghoe on the 8th February; thanks to Mick Morris and John Grant for coordinating so well.

My team and I spent some time at the coffee morning in beautiful St Michael and All Angels Church, and I updated those present on our continued push to get the Farthinghoe Bypass built, as well as answering questions on a range of topics – including Brexit. I'd also visited Farthinghoe Primary School earlier in the day, and I'm grateful to Wendy Whitehouse for showing me around and introducing me to her fantastic team and students; I was very impressed with Lauren and Maggie who took the time to talk me through their concerns about the need for the Bypass, and with the questions from Years 5 & 6. I called on several residents directly who had asked to see me, and it was good to hear a range of views on a number of issues.

On the Farthinghoe Bypass itself, I am working with the County Council, the South East Midlands Local Enterprise Partnership, and our new sub-regional transport body England's Economic Heartland Strategic Alliance to explore how we can fund the road's construction as soon as possible. I have called a meeting for early May (the next point all diaries could be coordinated to get the various principals of each organisation in the same room) to look at putting a bid for money forward through the newly announced Department for Transport's Major Road Network Fund. I understand that the next round of bids for funding need to be submitted in July, and I am pleased to have an agreement in principle from all three groups (NCC, SEMLEP & EEHSA) that the Farthinghoe Bypass is a worthy cause.

In other news, residents may have seen the recent reports in the press that I continue to raise my constituents' views on HS2 at all levels, and have written several times to the Chief Executive of HS2 Ltd, Mark Thurston, to put concerns from people in South Northants about the business case across directly. And I know that everyone in Farthinghoe will join with me in welcoming that construction of the new Brackley Medical Centre has started. It is a fantastic project that will deliver huge benefits for the residents of Brackley and the surrounding area, and will include GP services, a pharmacy, 16 intermediate "step-down" care beds, x-ray facilities, a minor injuries unit and other services across three storeys.

Winter Olympics Event: Unfortunately this Event has been cancelled due to lack of support. Tickets will be refunded in the next couple of weeks and we plan to run this next year on 4th May 2019.

New catering facility: There will be a regular Indian Curry van at the Village Hall on a Wednesday subject to the response from local Villages. There will be a flyer delivered to homes in Farthinghoe within the next two weeks, but the first opportunity will be in the carpark, Wednesday 6 March 7-8pm, for free samples of the food on offer in the following weeks. This should be a good addition to Village services as the Company regularly sells its food at the F1 Grand Prix at Silverstone.

2018 Achievements: The Committee is currently finalising its Goals for 2019, which will be published next month. However, it is worth pointing out the achievements for 2018.

- New comprehensive storage area within the Hall, replacing old bar and creating new bar facilities, with hot and cold water, fridge/freezer and glassware.
- Major themed events have raised significant funds; grants and other funding pursued and won.
- Improvements to gardens, planting and car parking area, BBQ area started.
- Improvements to décor, new shared library and audio/visual facilities, Fire safety, risk and asset assessments completed.
- Creation of a viable plan for the funding and installation of new heating and hot water system.
- New Storage container for school installed.

- Creation of transparent management structure, with minutes and ongoing plans available to the Village, with an enhanced relationship with regular hirers and stakeholders, Parish Council and School.
- New Website to allow bookings and events to be publicised, aiding marketing of the Hall and encouraging its use by both the Village and external hirers.

2019 Goals: These will be finalised at the end of March and available to view on the Village Hall noticeboard and Website (www.farthinghoevillagehall.org) where you can find all previous Minutes and various operational documents as well as a Calendar of Events and other information about the Hall.
