At the February Parish Council meeting, Cllr Grant reported on a meeting that he and Cllr Morris held with Chris Wragg and Ian Morris at Highways regarding the bypass. He reported that as the Farthinghoe project is less than £20m, it will have to be funded by Northamptonshire County Council and as has been widely reported, Northants County Council is currently in financial difficulty. The speculation therefore was that there would be no funding available. Cllr Grant has emailed Chris Wragg, asking if this interpretation was correct and is awaiting a response. Cllr Grant also intends to write to Andrea Leadsom MP to ask how she will be able to help with securing the £15M required. If funding is found, the £1M needed to draw up the initial scheme will still be required from Northants County Council which will continue to be an issue.

Should the project be valued at more than £20M, this would then be applicable for central government funding, so it may be worth re-planning the route to be further from the village or to extend the re-entry point beyond the Recycling Centre, which would not only be a benefit to the village but could then possibly qualify for central funding. This is a suggestion which the Parish Council will be putting forward strongly to Chris Wragg.

There was a comprehensive overview by Dave Hancock of his initial research into options for upgrading the heating and hot water system in the village hall. A project group is to be established to provide a recommended solution to the Parish Council and to investigate sources of funding. Various names were suggested but if you have any expertise in this area and would be willing to form part of the project group, please contact Dave Hancock by emailing dave.hancock?@gmail.com.

The village bus shelter is a community asset and is in need of some restorative maintenance, planned for the summer months. Cllr Bankes-Jones has conducted an initial assessment which will include attending to the elder trees behind the shelter which are threatening its existence, general weeding and weed suppression activities, replacement of some boards and attention to the seat support. Regrettably, this has been further exacerbated by a roofing services company recently displaying a sign illegally in the shelter, attaching it by more than 20 screws which went all the way through the boards, leaving holes when removed. The Clerk has tried unsuccessfully to make contact with the company to complain. If you do see any similar instances of illegal bill-posting around the village, please make the Clerk aware.

Please remember to put Wednesday, 18th April 2018 into your diaries for the Annual Parish Meeting, which this year will be much more interactive and less report-driven! The date has been moved to later in the month to avoid school holidays in order to encourage more people to attend. The next Parish Council Meeting will take place on **Wednesday**, 14th March 2018 at 7.00pm in the village hall. Public time will be from 7pm to 7.15pm.

FARTHINGHOE PRIMARY SCHOO!



It has been a busy few months at the primary school.

Our topic since Christmas has been Snow and Ice and we have been finding out about the Antarctic and Shackleton's Expedition to this extreme region. To start the topic we took the whole school to the Snozone in Milton Keynes, where we enjoyed a morning of sledging, hot chocolate and freshly cooked cookies. We had expected that for many of our children this would be their first experience of snow, surprisingly, with the change in our weather patterns, they had already experienced snow and its impact on Britain with an inopportune 'snow day' before Christmas ©



Our Key Stage 2 children (Years 5 and 6) were very busy before February half term. They visited the Milton Keynes Safety Centre, also known as 'Hazard Alley', which was the first of the purpose-built interactive education centres for children built in the UK. Here the children were presented with various 'real-life' scenarios and taught how to deal with them. These scenarios ranged from helping in a first aid incident to phoning for an ambulance and putting someone into the recovery

position.

You may also have seen our older children riding their bikes round the locality the week before half term. The children were taking part in the Bikeability cycle training programme, which enables the children to gain practical skills and understanding of how to cycle on today's roads.

There are three Bikeability levels, each designed to improve cycling skills, no matter what is known already. Levels 1, 2 and 3 take trainees from the basics of balance and control, all the way to planning and making an independent journey on busier roads. We are proud to say that all of our children successfully passed the first two levels.

1st March 2018 is World Book Day so you may have seen the children coming to school dressed in some strange guises. Our Charity Ambassadors have invited the children to come dressed up as their favourite book characters for a small donation, which will be given to our chosen charity, Dogs for Good. We have also asked the children to send in pictures of themselves reading books in extreme places i.e. up a tree, in a bath. We have had some very interesting pictures! These will be made into a display in the school but we are also hoping to post some on our website, please feel free to go online and have a look.







Central Heating

Dave Hancock is leading a Parish Council approved project to provide both hot water and a heating system into the Hall. The heating is necessary to preserve the building fabric and provide an improved environment for our users. This is both a complex and costly project which will require significant funding, so we will be looking for grants as well as putting on fund raising events. The system will be installed in time for next Winter if we can raise the funds!

Hall Improvements

The School storage container is now installed, with a rearrangement of the sheds allowing the new internal storage area to be repackaged. This will allow the Bar to be completed with plumbing and drainage installed. Upper level storage will be finalised after the Jumble Sale, so we should be 'tidy' for Summer with our new BBQ planned for a Spring inauguration.

We have purchased new curtains which are very colourful and bring the colour scheme together creating a cosier feel. We will be keeping the old curtains for events that require a neutral colour scheme.
