There have been a number of changes on the Parish Council over the last two months. The Parish Council now has three new Councillors; Trevor Jarvis, James Harrison and Barry Willett, who were all welcomed in at the September and October meetings.

In September's meeting I was appointed the Parish Clerk taking over from Philippa Clayton, who has kept the Council well briefed and organised for a number of years, and on behalf of the Parish Council may I say a great big "Thank you" for all of your dedication and hard work. And from a personal point of view I'd like to give you a very special thanks for the time you have spent, and continue to spend, helping and coaching me. I am very grateful for all the help and advice you've given me.

**Roads:** The village has seen more than its fair share of problems with roads and transport in the last few months, and the Parish Council continues to raise issues as and when they occur and place any updates on the Parish Council website. See

**Grit Bins:** You may have heard that Kier Northamptonshire Highways is reviewing its policy to maintain Grit Bins across the villages. Farthinghoe has two grit bins, one in Baker Street, and one in Bowling Green. Their proposal was to no longer maintain the Baker Street grit bin, and only maintain the one in Bowling Green.

The Council successfully decided to object to this proposal and as a result both Grit Bins will continue to be maintained.

There have also been some exciting new developments;

The village has successfully applied for a New Homes Bonus Local Community Grant funding and the following two projects will now forge ahead;

**Street Lighting:** A grant award has been approved towards the project costs for the replacement of 24 streetlights in the village.

**Village Hall Heating Updates:** A grant award has been approved for the installation of much needed high-performance roof space insulation. This will be followed by a new heating system once funds are available & decisions are made about the most effective type of heating.

**Important:** Finally, a request for you to sign up to the Village email database if you haven't done so already. This database is a very quick way of informing a large proportion of the village of critical issues that affect everyone. Events during the recent road closure have highlighted this need. We will not inundate you with mails.

We have 160 houses in the village and so far only 31 registrations on our database Please help us to keep you informed - it is easy to register.
