Your Parish Council has for the last few months been discussing the Precept Budget for 2019/20 as in January we had to submit our application for the year commencing 1 April 2019. We had discussed the budget in our November 2018 meeting and after a great deal of thought and discussion we finalised the Budget at our meeting on 9 January 2019.

We have reviewed last year's budget and the current services we are receiving in order to compile the Budget, and in terms of the recently installed Street Lighting project we have estimated savings of £350 per annum in electricity costs going forward, as well as savings on the street lighting maintenance, as the new lamps have a one year warranty period resulting in further savings of £287 for the year 2019/20.

As yet, we are unaware of any direct impact on services currently provided by Northamptonshire County Council, so along with these savings we have slightly increased our contingency fund for 2019/20 in anticipation of any changes to services when the new Unitary Councils come into being.

Taking all of this into consideration we have decided to apply for the same Precept of £7900 which is the same amount requested for 2018/19 meaning no increase in funding for the year ahead.

# Farthinghoe Residents Survey

We trust you have received the invitation from your local MP, Andrea Leadsom, to attend a coffee morning in the Church on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> February, 2019, from 10.00 to 11.30 hours. The purpose of her visit is to discuss the Residents Survey attached to the invitation.

This is NOT a political issue and is intended to provide you with the opportunity to raise with your Member of Parliament, any issues that affect your daily life.

Specifically, as your Parish Council, we have manoeuvred this meeting to demonstrate that Farthinghoe residents support a Bypass for Farthinghoe and we hope you will complete your Survey to reflect this desire and, if possible, also attend the meeting to confirm our desire for a Farthinghoe Bypass.

As you will see from the invitation, we are the closest we have ever been in securing funding for a Bypass, and we must continue to keep the pressure on our MP to achieve this objective. It will be a long time before we get a similar opportunity and recent events have demonstrated how nice it would be to have a Bypass.

We are concerned that all the replies to the Survey reach Andrea Leadsom, in time for the meeting, and to this end, members of your Parish Council propose to collect your reply and post these in one parcel. We propose to collect, house to house, over the weekend of 26<sup>th</sup>/27<sup>th</sup> January 2019 and trust this provides you with sufficient time to complete your questionnaire.

If we miss your collection please contact your local Parish Councillor or post through our letter boxes and if we have not posted sufficient copies of the Survey for all eligible family members in your household, please advise your local Parish Councillor.

The following initiative detailed in the document following on pages 6 and 7 has been received from South Northants County Council.

In light of recent thefts in the Village, specifically, the lead from the Church Roof, your Parish Council would like to pursue this initiative and establish if we can secure Grant monies to fund purchase of the CCTV equipment.

We are considering using the CCTV equipment as a mobile unit and installing this on Main Street for say 6 months/annum and then at the top of Baker Street at the junction of Queens Street, for the next 6 months.

We recognise that some villagers may object to this proposal because it is considered to be an infringement of personal liberties and we are therefore seeking your approval to continue with this initiative.

If you object to this proposal please e-mail <u>traffic@farthinghoeparishcouncil.org</u> <u>or raise</u> the matter with your local Parish Councillor.

Non - responses will be considered as acceptance of this proposal, as will a majority vote in excess of 60%.

We hope you will support this initiative and would be grateful if your responses could be lodged by the closing date of 9<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

# **CCTV**

# **Proposal for Town and Parish Councils**



We all know that Police and Local Authority resources are under enormous pressure, and have limited available front line personnel especially in the more rural towns and villages.

Here at South Northamptonshire Council we have been looking at how best to tackle the issues of anti-social behaviour, crime and disorder in our District, and have been exploring ways in which we can safeguard our residents and provide them with some level of protection from these issues.

We are proposing to introduce a CCTV network across the district and would like to invite your Town/Parish Council to look into the possibility of joining us in this project by purchasing a CCTV camera(s) for your town/village.

The advantages for you would be that the system is

- 100% portable and can be moved from location to location
- Live feed and retrospective viewing functions
- Operated by South Northamptonshire Council and Police jointly with Police Control Room access to live feed for ongoing incidents
- Evidential quality footage
- ANPR (automatic number place recognition) can be added where required
- Operates in both light and darkness
- Cost effective way of deterring crime in the area

We would be looking at these two potential options:

- Purchase of dedicated camera(s) for your Parish area. Cost estimated at £5,000.
- A contribution to a deployable camera that will be taken to an area on request. Cost estimate £300-£500 (Parish would pay cost of connection to network and not guaranteed if already deployed)
