RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS – JUNE 2018

As I write this there is a gathering of excitement for the Royal wedding which will be done and dusted by the time this article is read, but as is said to many a wedding couple, a wedding is for a day, a marriage is for life. And I guess that our royal couple will have had their moments of nerves as they prepared for their wedding, with all the extra pressure they have from their position and from the media attention. But our hopes and prayers for them will be that their marriage will be life-long and life-giving.

Yet anybody entering into a new relationship must do so with some nerves. For it is entering into an unknown and involves a period of building up trust as the relationship develops. The experts tell us that infatuation can last for days and even months or years, but love lasts a lifetime. So let us remember and pray for all couples who will be getting married this summer. May their day be filled with excitement and joy and may the future be filled with all goodness.

The bible describes Jesus' relationship to the church in the terms of a bride and groom. The church being known as the bride of Christ and Jesus is pictured as the groom. St. Paul when he wrote his famous letter to the church in Corinth put it this way:- ." The May meeting of the Parish Council is the Annual General Meeting when we cover many items of administration needed to prepare us for the forthcoming year. We are pleased to announce that Mick Morris has been re-appointed Chairman for 2018/2019. Mick, who held the position of Vice Chairman of the Council from May 2015 to May 2016, was appointed Chairman for 2017/2018 and during his year as Chair has been working very hard on behalf of the parish in many areas but particularly road safety, street lighting and continuing to pursue a bypass. David Dashwood was re-appointed as Vice Chairman for 2018/2019. David is a long-standing councillor, who has previously held the Chairman's role and is well versed in the ways of the council.

With the resignation of Jenny Forbes and Ross van Geest from the Parish Council, we currently have two vacancies. These were officially registered with the Returning Officer at South Northants District Council and notices placed, advising that requests for an election to fill the vacancies should be received by 18 May 2018. As no such requests have been made, we are now able to fill the positions by co-option. If you are interested in joining the Parish Council, please contact either the Clerk or the Chairman. If you are unsure what it entails, please come along to the next Parish Council meeting, where we would be delighted for you to observe the proceedings.

We are also looking to recruit a new Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer and details can be found on the noticeboards. The monthly hours have been revised from 10 to 15 per month, to be reviewed during the budget process at the end of the year. Our current Clerk and RFO, Pip Clayton, would be very happy to explain the role to anyone who may be interested in this paid position. The annual accounting process is completed during the Annual General Meeting and the period for the exercise of public rights to inspect and make copies of any accounting records will commence on Monday 4 June through to Friday 13 July 2018. The records can be viewed at the Clerk's premises by prior appointment. The Annual Return and Internal Audit Report will be available on the website, www.farthinghoeparishcouncil.org from 4th June 2018.

The next Parish Council Meeting will take place on **Wednesday**, 13th June 2018 at 7.00pm in the village hall. Public time will be from 7pm to 7.15pm.

VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR

With the defibrillator now in position by The Fox at Farthinghoe and the training having taken place a few months ago, below are the steps you should take in the case of an emergency with a patient in cardiac arrest:

• Ring 999

- As well as talking to you about the patient, the 999 service will despatch an emergency first responder to you who may be closer than an ambulance and will know where to find the defibrillator. Therefore if you are alone with the patient, you can be assured that the defibrillator and support will be with you very quickly.
- If there is more than one person available, one person should stay with the patient and the other person can fetch the defibrillator from the box, which is not locked.
- On returning with the defibrillator, the 999 operator will talk you through how to use the defibrillator, so even if you weren't able to attend the training or if you are feeling unsure, you will be given the steps needed to operate the device.


