# RECTOR'S LETTER—JUNE 2015

It is amazing that a year ago there was new face on the block, we welcomed the Reverend Shemil Mathew as our new assistant curate to our five villages. Over the past year his new face has become a recognised face to many people as he has worked all over the place. From a familiar smile at coffee mornings to the organiser of Messy Church at Farthinghoe and Hinton. Now we are looking forward to the next stage in his journey when on 27<sup>th</sup> June he will be ordained a priest by the Bishop of Peterborough at Peterborough Cathedral. His ordination to priest is on top of his ordination to deacon, just as mine and all priests are. As a priest he will be given authority to conduct weddings, preside at communions and declare God's forgiveness and blessing. A whole coach load of parishioners will be going to Peterborough Cathedral to support him there. 

# **COMPOST CORNER**

I have a confession to make; I have made cauliflower cheese with the beautiful cauliflower from my allotment. Why do I need to confess? These came to glorious fruition last month – truly, things of beauty; their white curds, the size and shape of a human brain, concealed under the protective pale green outer leaves, so not immediately visible until you start to peer more closely. The first cauliflower I harvested, I simply steamed, to enjoy it for its own sake in all its magnificence. Fred agreed that was the best way to eat fresh cauliflower and proceeded to decry the practice of swamping it with cheese sauce. Blast! I thought, that's my next plan for dinner thwarted! Even Joel and Lucie, who had also just harvested

# JOAN LEWIS

Joan Lewis known and respected by many in Farthinghoe died on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2015. Joan, who would have celebrated her 92<sup>nd</sup> birthday in May was an only child born in the farming community of West Harling in Norfolk. The start of WW2 ended her ambition of having a university education and after a few years earning her living she married Robert Lewis at the age of 19. Joan and Bob and their growing family moved into Abbey Lodge Farthinghoe in the early 1960s, beginning a long and happy time in the house.

As well as bringing up sons Yorick and Adam and daughter Roberta (Bobbie) Joan fostered well over 100 children from broken homes and deprived backgrounds, many of whom kept in touch with her over the years. Brother and sister, Gabriel and Clare, attended her

funeral service and Clare's speech was a testament to the care and love she gave to so many needy children. She was honoured for her work with an invitation to a Buckingham Palace Garden Party held for those who tirelessly work for others.

Her work didn't end with children – she kept goats, chickens, grew vegetables and had a passion for cats. Over the past couple of years she had many spells in hospital and her last words before being wheeled into the ambulance on every occasion would always be "Look after the cats for me"!

Many village residents will have their own memories of Joan who was a staunch member of the WI, Farthinghoe Friends, Scrabble Club and a regular supporter of the WEA lectures, the Farthinghoe branch having been started by her husband. She liked to draw and together with friends Gloria Loakes, Eileen Agard and Diana Stockwell (all now deceased) she attended various art classes locally. She had a keen interest in literature and visits to Kings Sutton and Chipping Norton Literary Festivals were not-to-be-missed days out; she was an avid reader right up to her death, including The Times every day and still had firm opinions on world events!

Joan was a lovely person and will be greatly missed by many people.

# PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The draft minutes from the Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> May are now available on the Parish Council website.

Whilst writing, I can hear Highways working away on Main Road. The improved road surface is also aimed at reducing traffic noise; whilst it's very early days, as a resident on Main Road, it does appear to have had a marked effect, although the proof of the pudding will be once the heavy lorries start again on Monday.

By the time the Chronicle hits your doormats, we will have had a visit from Northamptonshire Highways to discuss the traffic issues within the village. Ron Sawbridge, our County Councillor, will be joined by Chris Wragg, Team Leader, Transport Planning, Northamptonshire Highways and Helen Howard, Community Liaison Officer, Northamptonshire Highways. The visit is partly in response to the discussion which took place at April's APM and several members of the Parish Council are meeting with the visitors to highlight the severity of the problems we have and to look at possible ways forward.

May's Parish Council meeting saw the formation of the new Parish Council, albeit the members remain unchanged. The first item on the agenda was to appoint a new Chairman and we are pleased to announce that Ross van Geest has been reappointed. Since Ross took over as Chair in Autumn last year, he has had a strongly positive impact on many areas of council work and it's great that he is going to be able to continue his good work. John Grant announced that he would not be seeking re-election as Vice Chair as he felt it was time for someone else to take on the mantle. Mick Morris was therefore voted in as Vice Chair. The councillors wish to thank John for all of his years serving as Vice Chair and are pleased that he will continue as a councillor, providing a wealth of knowledge and experience.

The noticeboard by the Fox pub has fallen into a state of disrepair over the last few years and it was agreed during the meeting that this should be refurbished. The situation of this second noticeboard at the opposite end of the village will hopefully mean that it will be easier for everyone to access general notices that are posted by the Parish Council. This may be seen as a small step, but every little bit helps!

Following the APM, we had a small flurry of registrations to the email database but would urge more of you to sign up. This can be done by either emailing the Chair or the Clerk (contact details are on the second page of the Chronicle) or by completing the online form on the website. This is seen as an invaluable tool in being able to communicate with the village regarding vital issues such as major planning applications or updates on traffic and road problems.

The next Parish Council meeting will be taking place on Wednesday, 10<sup>th</sup> June at 7pm in the Beasley Room at the Village Hall. The agenda will be posted on the village noticeboard 3 days in advance of the meeting.
