MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF FARTHINGHOE PARISH COUNCIL

HELD ON WEDNESDAY, 12th FEBRUARY 2014 AT 7.00pm AT THE VILLAGE HALL

Public Time. Twelve villagers attended and were part of the Farthinghoe Action Group campaigning against the proposed Solar Farm. There was such a weight of feeling against this proposal that those present wanted to know why it was not on the agenda. Due process needed to be afforded to this and what was the PC doing to represent the action group? The group has the support of local MP, Andrea Leadsom.

The Chair advised that the PC will consider both sides of the argument and respond to a planning application if and when submitted. There are 176 properties in the village and it is a minority of these that are expressing their concerns.

As part of the proposal, Green Energy UK is prepared to offer solar panels to be used in a way to benefit the village. This would form part of a Section 106 Agreement as part of the planning application.

The group needs to have a plan of action and the PC is not prepared to put anything in the Chronicle on behalf of Green Energy or the Action Group: the Chronicle needs to remain impartial.

The Action Group had canvassed door to door to promote the Open Meeting organised by Green Energy for 13th February.

Other low lying sites may be available: one householder is only 40 metres from this proposed site. Brown field sites are more appropriate and what about the roofs of warehouses? The group would like the support of the PC.

6. Traffic Issues:

- **6.1** The budget would be tight until 2014. The PC needed to write to Andrea Leadsom highlighting the proposed Solar Farm and how it might affect a future bypass.
- **6.2** Cllr Forbes had contacted Street Doctor to repair the deep potholes along Hinton Road to the Airfield and attend to the flooding at the juntion of the A422 and on the sharp corner by Green Lane. A site meeting has been requested with Highways for more permanent repairs to be carried out.
- **6.3** The speed camera had not been in operation for the last twelve months but was it now working because it had been turned round?

7. SNC Local Plan Consultation

Cllr Thomas had collated the comments which the PC believed to be an appropriate response to reflect the views of the village. Cllr Thomas had negotiated an extension to the deadline to enable the full PC to formally agree to submit to SNC.

8. Community Funding

Green Energy had contacted the Chair expressing an interest in providing a funding stream for the school from solar panels which could generate £300 - £400 per megawatt. This funding would be in the region of £3,000 per year for 25 years. It would be a Section 106 agreement as part of a planning application. Once an application is submitted it might be worthwhile to form a group to try and represent the views of all residents. Green Energy's approach so far has not been very professional.

9. Annual Parish Meeting 9th April 2014

This meeting would take place after the April Parish Council meeting. Cllr Grant will book the Village Hall. **Update:** Village Hall booked.

10. Playground noise complaint

Cllr Grant had received another email from a resident living near to the playground who maintains that the playground should be out of bounds after sundown and that there should be a sign to this effect. As these incidents are very infrequent and children do tend to make a noise, the Parish Council agreed that it is not necessary to put up a sign. Cllr Grant would reply and bring this matter to a close. Cllr Dashwood is willing to be contacted at the time of any incident in the future.

11. Planning Matters:

11.1 Limes Farm need support from the Parish Council to get a variation to the condition which only permitted them to serve of food from 9.00am – 5.00pm. All ticket events have been held after 5.00pm and these events have been very successful and the PC fully supports what they have been doing and would support any application to amend the existing condition.
