## FARTHINGHOE PLAYPARK

Phase A of the renovation of Farthinghoe Playpark is now complete and an official opening was held on Friday 23 October.

A blessing was provided by Reverend Shamil Mathew, and as a gesture of village thanks to the Dashwood family's generosity for the donation of the plot of land, Mrs Ruth Dashwood, was asked to perform the ribbon cutting ceremony.

The new playpark will now be formally known as the Dashwood Playpark.

This project has taken a couple of years to come to fruition and has been achieved thanks to the vision, fundraising and hard work of four village mums - Rachael Boyd, Jenny Johnston, Beste Bragg and Louise Reid.

The recent Cocktail Evening & Auction was a wonderful initiative and provided a huge financial contribution toward the Playpark. Other projects are in the pipeline and if these are supported in similar fashion, we will be able to support other schemes to benefit the village.

Phase B for enhancement of the Dashwood Playpark is scheduled to take place, Spring 2016, and a questionnaire seeking village views will be circulated early 2016.

## RECTOR'S LETTER NOVEMBER 2015

November is full of special services. Starting with Service of All Souls on 1 November when we remember our loved ones departed and light a candle for them. The theme of candles is continued through the month with the weekly evening candle prayer service.

November 8<sup>th</sup> sees our communities gathering around our war memorials as we remember the fallen, those who gave their lives for others. At Aynho, Evenley and Croughton this will be at the outside memorials and at Farthinghoe and Hinton in the churches.

A special family service will take place on November 15<sup>th</sup> at 4pm At Saint Michael and All Angels church Farthinghoe where we will be blessing our Christmas Cribs and figures before they start their journeys around our villages on their way to our Christmas Crib services. If you have a Christmas Crib, you are invited to bring it to this service for a blessing. During the service we will also be making Advent candles wreaths in preparation for our count down to Christmas. During Advent the 24 days before Christmas the blessed cribs from the church also known as the 'Holy Family' will be traveling around various homes in our villages. Here they offer your family a chance to be part of the Christmas preparations, echoing the journey Mary and Joseph took on their way to Bethlehem. The end of their journey culminates on Christmas Eve, more details next month.

The highlight of October's Parish Council meeting was receiving the report on the completion of the village playpark. This was a major project for the village and has been achieved through the significant efforts of a number of dedicated people. The Parish Council will be thanking those directly involved individually but thanks must also go to all of the villagers who have supported the numerous fundraising activities that have taken place over the last few years. It's testament to what can be achieved when the village comes together and I am very proud to be a part of such a fantastic community.

It has been observed that people have made use of the entrance to the playpark as a parking area. This is obviously very unsafe, both for users of the playpark and for motorists reversing back out onto New Road. The Parish Council will be erecting a post in the near future to prevent this from recurring.

I mentioned in October's Chronicle that we would be looking to hold an exhibition on the potential bypass routes for the village. The dates have yet to be finalised, but we are currently looking at a Friday and Saturday on consecutive dates in December. It is likely that the exhibition would be open from 1pm to 7pm on the first day and from 10am to 2pm on the weekend day. Hopefully that would accommodate the majority with regard to working hours. Once the dates have been finalised, these will be advertised on the parish noticeboards and through the email database. 
A high standard of entries to the show this year left **Will Dorward** winning Best in Show for the Garden and **Susan Hampson** winning the prize for the kitchen.

## SEVEN SISTERS TREE SITE

An Introduction: Many older residents of Farthinghoe remember Sam and Dorothy Deeley, parents of Jim, Tony and John. Sam continued the family tradition of farming and Dorothy is remembered for her numerous village activities including the W.I., Chapel Sunday school, a village school governor; she organised coach trips to Wickstead Park and Hunstanton, the village carol singers and she was leader of the village Red Cross Branch where the younger generation learnt First Aid, etc. In addition she still found time to be a keen gardener and look after a growing family which increased during the '39/'45 War when German and Italian prisoners of war were employed on Limes Farm. One of those Italian prisoners wrote to the Deeley family after the peace in 1946 thanking them for their kindness. He wrote that he "felt like one of the family" and Dorothy was his "English mother" – a fine tribute to her and the Deeley family. Thus when John's Millennium Tree Site idea was proposed on Jim's hilltop location for the use of Farthinghoe they continued their mother's community service.

**This is your site, your trees, your garden area, your chance for community service and to establish a pocket park here at Farthinghoe.**

The completed Site Work so far -

We have fenced the site area on the Cockley Road hill, purchased and planted seven oak trees, now 20 years old, and registered the site.

We have created and buried a time capsule with contributions from residents and the school children of Farthinghoe in the year 2000.

We have provided seating, good access and car parking and set up a website:

The next objectives -

The planting of wild flowers beds etc. with defined areas for all residents of Farthinghoe and friends so each can have a personal "family garden" with a pleasant mown grass area for picnics with seating and thereby establish a "pocket park" for Farthinghoe; and we wish now to appoint additional trustee conservation volunteers to join our group to help us achieve this.

A trustee volunteer will be able to:

- ❖ Access the Site at all times for their personal enjoyment of the area together with their relations and friends;
- ❖ Have a personal "golden key" to access the Tree Site – for insurance purposes the site is locked at all times.
- ❖ All trustees may have their ashes spread or interred at the Site and after 10 years' membership this would be free of charge.
- ❖ All trustees will be able to register for a small (2 sq.m) conservation family garden in which to plant their choice of wild flowers.

Since the site is on a perpetuity annual rental basis a trustee will be able to donate this garden to their children/grandchildren if they wished to continue the annual membership rental. All trustees have automatic membership of The National Conservation Volunteers and have personal accident cover through this large society.

From our hilltop Site there are excellent views of the area but also excellent viewing of the stars above and the International Space Station and flight details are always available to members upon request.

Trustee membership is open to all residents of Farthinghoe, their relations and friends who have an interest in conservation.

Our group meets twice a year for general discussion meetings for the future of the Tree Site when all ideas are welcomed! We should love to hear from any interested volunteers.
