2. Minutes of the meeting on 8th September 2010 had been circulated. The minutes were taken as read, adopted and signed.

3. Matters Arising.

- **3.1** Cllr Wall had attended the presentation night for Best Village Competition. Farthinghoe was highly commended and came third in the newcomer's category. The judges were impressed and if the village enters next year, it was suggested that some photographs be included to show what goes on in the village.
- **3.2** The Clerk had spoken to Central Networks who are going to try and find out why the redundant wooden poles on Main Road have not been removed now the new lighting columns are in place. The original contractors are no longer working for Central Networks. The Clerk was told that she would be kept informed if there was anything to report.

6. Traffic Issues – Cockley Road junction

Further to the e-mail from Bridget Castle and the concerns that had been raised during Public Time, could anything be done to try and alleviate the problem caused by the cars parked outside of school? It is difficult for vehicles trying to turn in to Cockley Road. Cllr Mellor would write to Highways to see if there was any method of restriction that could be imposed.

7. Draft budget 2011 - 2012

It was agreed to make the donation to the Almshouses and money would be included in the budget to enable the Parish Council to make a donation to the Brackley Area Volunteer Car Service during the next financial year.

Next year is election year and the Parish Council needed to include an extra £1400 in the budget to cover the cost if the election was to be contested.

The cost of emptying the dog waste bin would be approximately £50.

The budget would be amended and although expenditure for 2011- 2012 could be in the region of £8,000, it is anticipated that the precept will remain at the same level (£6,500) because reserves will be used to cover any difference between the precept and expenditure.

8. Brackley Area Volunteer Car Service

The Parish Council agreed to allocate £300 towards the cost of the service if their funding is cut next year.

9. Planning Matters

Cllr Grant declared an interest and left the meeting as the first item to be discussed was Corner Cottage, Chapel Lane.

- **9.1** Cllr Grant had been advised that all he needed for the rear dormer extension was a certificate of legality. This was not the case and Cllr Grant had been advised by SNC that he needed to apply for planning permission. The Council had no objections to the retrospective application S/2010/1232/FUL at Corner Cottage Cllr Grant rejoined the meeting.
- **9.2** It has been recommended that application S/2010/1020/FUL for the catering facility ancillary to the farm shop at **Limes Farm** be approved subject to no objections from NCC Highways. It will also be subject to access for large vehicles being from the A422 and not Manor Lane.
- **9.3 S/2010/1032/FUL** for the porch, rear and side extensions at **The Old Forge** has been refused. "The design, size and form do not reflect the simplistic style of the building in a Conservation Area".
- **9.4** The Parish Council supported the application, S/2010/1176/FUL, to replace flat roof, extended to link to main house and replacement first floor front wall at **Horse Shoe Lea**, Cockley Road.
- **9.5 Farthinghoe Primary School** had applied (S/2010/1186/PCC) for a single storey classroom extension and external canopy. The Parish Council had no objections in principle but thought the design was incongruous with the existing building. There is also the ongoing problem of parking at the school.
- **9.6** An appeal has been made against SNC's refusal of the application to rebuild part of Cockley Barn to create agricultural office and workshop and for a barn conversion to residential use at **Cockley Barn Farm.**

- 2. Cllr Wall asked for the litter bin to be re-instated outside Far View House.
