

# Rector's Letter

## Mothering Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March

Mothering Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> March falls in the middle of Lent and gets its name from the tradition of those in service being allowed to go home to their mother or home church.

For those not in service they would go to the large church in the district or even to the cathedral which is our main mother church. Over the years this tradition has given way to celebrating our mothers, but the two ideas can be combined by celebrating our mothers in our mother church. At our morning services we welcome everybody to come and celebrate together and posies of flowers will be blessed and given out during the Mothering Sunday Services. I hope to see you there.

# Palm Sunday 24th March

On Palm Sunday we remember the day that Jesus entered into Jerusalem riding on a donkey and was greeted by welcoming crowds who waved palm branches like banners in their joy. This year Palm Sunday falls on a Benefice Sunday when all our five village churches meet together to worship. As this is a special Sunday we will be meeting for 10am at All Saints School, Croughton to start our service with the blessing of the palm crosses and then process to church, re-enacting in a small way Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. At church we will listen to a dramatised telling of his passion, the last week of his life before his death. The end of the communion service will be followed with refreshments.

## Holy Week 25<sup>th</sup>-31<sup>st</sup> March

Holy Week is the week between Palm Sunday and Easter and is the most holy week of the Christian year. Each day there are special services in each of our five churches as we relive Jesus' final week. This has always been a time when Christians made extra efforts to attend church

#### **Compline Services**

Compline Service is a short service of Night Prayer or Prayers at the End of the Day. It is the final church service of the day in the Christian tradition of canonical hours. The English word *Compline* is derived from the Latin *completorium*, as Compline is the completion of the working day.

## Maundy Thursday 28th March

This is the day that Jesus shared his last supper with his disciples and when he was then betrayed and arrested. This year we will remember and re-enact that last meal in an extended Eucharist or Maundy meal. This will take place in Aynho Village Hall from 7pm and combines a simple 3 course meal with a Communion or Eucharist following Jesus' command to do this in remembrance of him. There will be no charge for the meal, but for catering purposes we ask that you sign up on the lists in church.

## Good Friday 29th March

Is the day that Jesus died on the cross. It is only good because his death lead to his resurrection and proof of his power over sin. We celebrate Good Friday at 11am in the morning with two All Age Praise Services at Evenley and Aynho followed by hot cross buns. In the afternoon we have 'an hour at the cross' between 2pm and 3pm as we remember the last hour that Jesus suffered before his death. This is a reflective service for adults.

**Easter Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> March** No services this day as it was the Jewish Sabbath and Jesus was dead in the tomb.

## Easter Sunday 31st March

On Easter Day the church is bursting full of life and joy as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection. All our preparations during Lent come to fullness and completion as we welcome our Lord's new life into ours. Our churches are full of flowers and colours and the coming of the Paschal Candle signifies Jesus' presence with us and his disciples. The empty Easter Egg reminds us of the empty tomb. The Egg full with sweets reminds us of the gift of new life that Jesus brings. Come and join the

# **Obituary**

# **Cedric Marsden Healey**

Born in Worlaby, Lincolnshire on 4<sup>th</sup> January 1922 into a large family of five brothers and two sisters. He started work at 14 on the Colleague Farm in Worlaby and worked alongside his elder brother Bert.

Cedric was a keen darts player and cycled into Brigg some five miles, every weekend with his brother Bert and went from pub to pub playing as many matches as possible. Cedric also played football for the village team and they were runners up in the Scunthorpe & District Football League final of 1947-48 and he still has the cup. He was also a life long supporter of Sheffield Wednesday.

He met his wife Ivy who lived in the next village, at the local dancing club where romance blossomed and they married in 1950 and had two children Patrick and Jane. In 1956 they decided to move down to Farthinghoe to work for Mr Dashwood and to be nearer to Ivy's sister who was then living in Birmingham.

Cedric began work as a farm labourer but soon found his skill as a ploughman a job he particularly liked. He loved working the land throughout the seasons, setting the seeds in spring, bailing hay and straw in the summer and of course ploughing in the autumn. Whenever on holiday he would always check ploughed fields to see how straight the furrows were. He was also a keen gardener, growing vegetables for the family and keeping his lawn in pristine condition.

He continued his love of darts and played regularly for the village pub, The Fox, where he also enjoyed a game of dominoes or cribbage most Sunday lunchtimes and he was also a member of the Aunt Sally team in the summer – haymaking permitting.

After his retirement Cedric continued to enjoy his garden and allotment and both he and Ivy helped with the church cleaning. In his later years he could often be seen in and around the village on his buggy until ill health forced him to hang up his driving gloves.

He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

# Farthinghoe's Foodies

# The column about food by 'foodies' in Farthinghoe

**HORSEMEAT** and its recent appearance in the UK Food Chain has been excellent 'fodder' for those of us in a position to mock from a safe distance.

More serious however if you are a consumer trusting enough of major supermarkets to believe it's safe to buy value end products and reasonable enough to expect they are wholesome and honest.

Even more sinister is the mystery that surrounds where on earth this meat came from -no one seems to have a clue although suspicions are rife (and grim), and still less is understood about the antibiotics or other potentially carcinogenic chemicals that could be in this meat, never intended for human consumption.

If all-powerful retailers have lost control of their supply base to this extent, the implications are worrying for all of us who ever buy processed food.



One solution to this problem is simple and highly accessible to us lucky folks in Farthinghoe! Buy local, grow your own - plus eat fewer burgers of course.

In season right now - Jerusalem Artichokes - and definitely free from horsemeat (although arguably

not horse manure if grown in Farthinghoe allotments!).

These gems are an underrated winter treat, not blessed with good looks but surprisingly easy to cook and with a unique nutty smoothness. They can be a bit fiddly to peel - a small paring knife is required to avoid scraping away potato peeling sized slices from the outside which will leave you with a vegetable the size of peanut.

Try roasting – by simply peeling them, tossing in a splash of oil (rapeseed is favoured – lovely subtle flavour), adding a twist of salt and black pepper and roast for about 20-30 minutes until soft. Avoid overcooking – they turn to mush and that lovely texture is lost to the bottom of the baking tray. Serve with crusty bread for a warming winter supper.

Soup made with Jerusalems is also wonderful. The nuttiness is quite remarkable and tastes like it has taken hours to achieve. Easy to make - grab a good couple of handfuls of chopped shallots or onions and sweat them off in butter over a medium to low heat for 10-20 or more minutes to intensify the flavour. Add a little salt and black pepper, and 500g or so of peeled and chopped artichokes (one inch cubes are fine). Toss the artichokes in the buttery onion mixture for 2-3 minutes, and then add about 1-1.5 pints of good vegetable stock. Simmer until the artichokes are softened (about 20 minutes), then blitz in a blender to create a divine smooth texture. Return to the pan, adjust seasoning, and stir in a few of drops of lemon juice and a splash of rapeseed oil. I like it served with crusty bread, lashings of butter and a good wedge of hard goats cheese on the side.
