RECTOR'S LETTER

March sees the church in the middle of the season of Lent. But what is lent all about? I would like to suggest the following might help:

 $L \sim$ is that it is a time for looking to Jesus and the example he set. We remember the 40 days of formation he spent in the wilderness following his Baptism by John the Baptist before his public ministry.

 $E \sim$ it is a time of preparation for Easter. When we celebrate Jesus' power of death and sin. Lent is a time for self reflection, a time to be honest with yourself.

 $N \sim Not$ doing things, or giving things up for Lent. This could be from chocolate or alcohol to television or swearing. Each in its own way helps us to be more disciplined and controlled. If you give up something, then put the money you saved to help somebody else or a charity. Get a double helping of goodness, if you like, for your acts.

 $T \sim Trying$ to be good. Often this can be a result of giving up something bad or unhealthy. But is can also be about putting others needs above our own.

Out of all of the above L.E.N.T. I would like to encourage you to be generous in the Trying to be good section. Many people set out a wall chart of Acts of Kindness board and each of the 40 days of lent, try and do something generous or some extra act of kindness above and beyond their normal rounds.

This can be a great thing for children and families to engage with. You can make your own chart or download many from the internet. I would suggest:

What is 40acts? 40acts is a generosity challenge, which invites people to do Lent a bit differently. During the forty days of Lent, 40acts participants will be invited to take part in forty simple acts of generosity, which will challenge them to 'do Lent generously' in 2015. Lent marks a pivotal point in the history of the church, when Jesus prepared to give himself up as a sacrifice. Traditionally we mark Lent by giving something up, but what if it could be more than that? What if Lent was a preparation for a lifetime of bigheartedness? Small acts of generosity, performed by thousands of people across the UK and beyond, have the power to make a big change to our communities, to our churches and ultimately, to our world.

Come and join me in 40 Acts of generosity this Lent and lets all help make our world a better place.

Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday 29th March marks the start of Holy Week. This year we start our Palm Sunday procession at 10am from All Saints School in Croughton, with the blessing of our Palm crosses. We will then process the short distance to All Saints Church, the service will start when the procession arrives. At church, in the context of a Communion Service, we hear again the telling of our Lord Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, remember his last supper and passion, before spending the next 7 days, of Holy Week in our final preparations for Easter.



PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Farthinghoe Parish Council has been working hard to clearly define its aims and objectives over the next 12 months. One of our key aims is to increase communication with parishioners and a great deal of progress has already been completed.

We have a new-look website, administered by the council itself.

 - Greater control over content
 - Improved speed of response to updates and development to the site
 - Now mobile-phone friendly
 - Provides contact details for all councillors
 - Already compliant with the new transparency codes for Parish Councils – we are ahead of the game!

- Commitment to approve electronically and upload the Parish Council minutes to the website within circa 2 weeks
 - Provides parishioners with a very current understanding of key debates and decisions
- Future developments planned:
 - Dedicated page for the village hall
 - Potential village "blog"



Speed of communication within the Parish is also critical and this is an area that, during significant events in 2014, was shown to need improvement. The Parish Council has decided to implement an email communication system whereby members of the parish can opt in to critical email updates from the Parish Council. For absolute clarity, critical email updates would include threats to the village which need to be addressed quickly by the Parish Council and the community. Such threats would most likely include new planning applications that impact the vast majority of the village as well as other high priority issues. We fully appreciate that not all of the village currently has access to the internet but if a good percentage of the village signed up for email updates, those people could then pass on information to others who may not have internet access.

It has also been agreed that the notice board by the Fox will be upgraded, as it has fallen into disrepair over the years. With email communications, two noticeboards, the Farthinghoe Chronicle and the opportunity to attend Public Time at the monthly Parish Council meetings, we believe we are putting into place a varied and robust communication policy to improve sharing of vital information across the village.
